  - Enhance quality and outcome measures

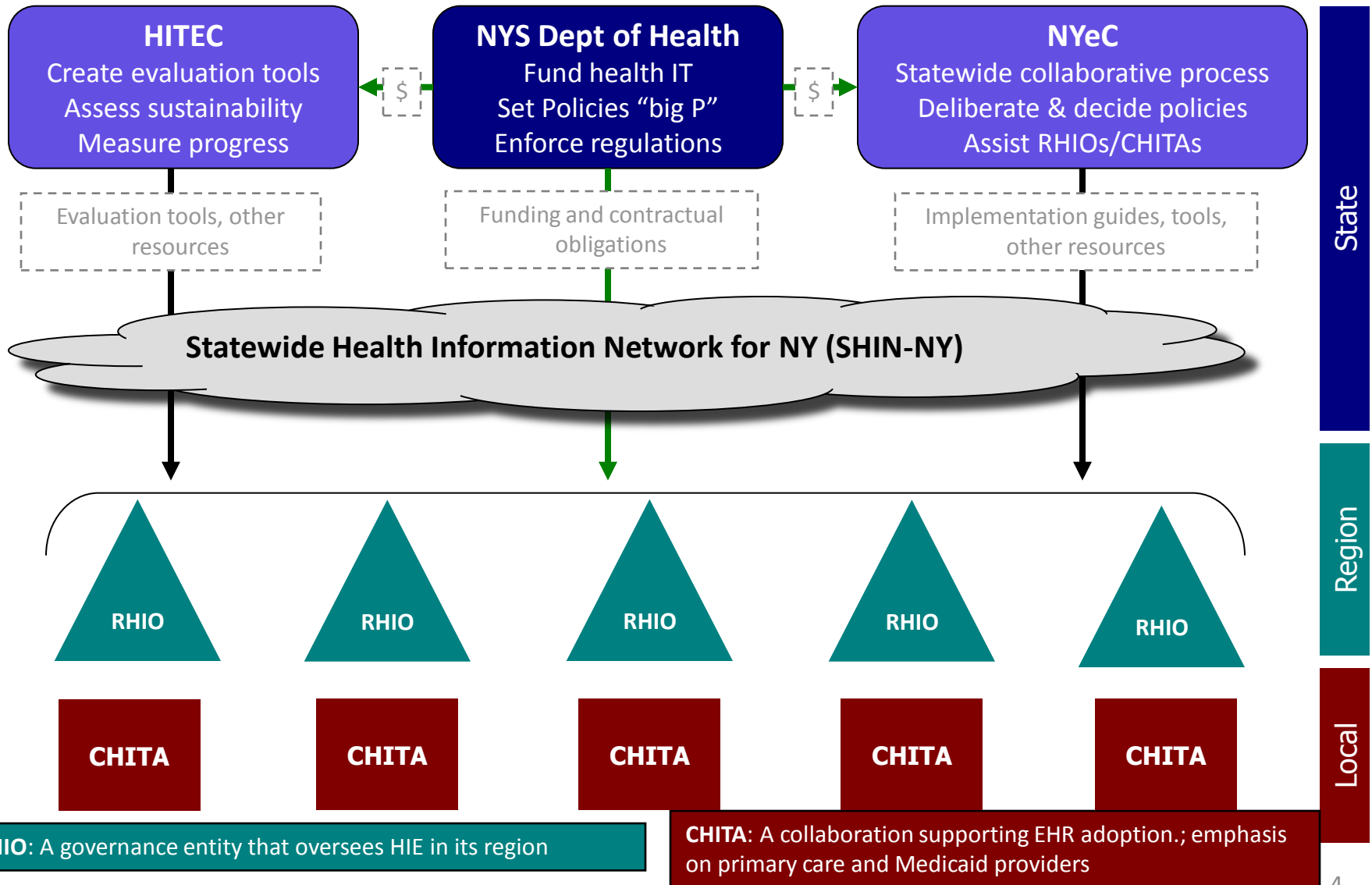
OVERALL STRATEGY IS ABOUT SYSTEMS CHANGE,

# Building Blocks for Interoperable Health IT

- Governance
  - State, NYeC
  - RHIOs
- Policies and standards
  - Privacy, technical, business/contracting
- Clinical use
  - Structured use cases, decision support
- Technical requirements
  - Web-based data exchange protocols
- Adoption support
  - “Soup to nuts” implementation support provided in a community context

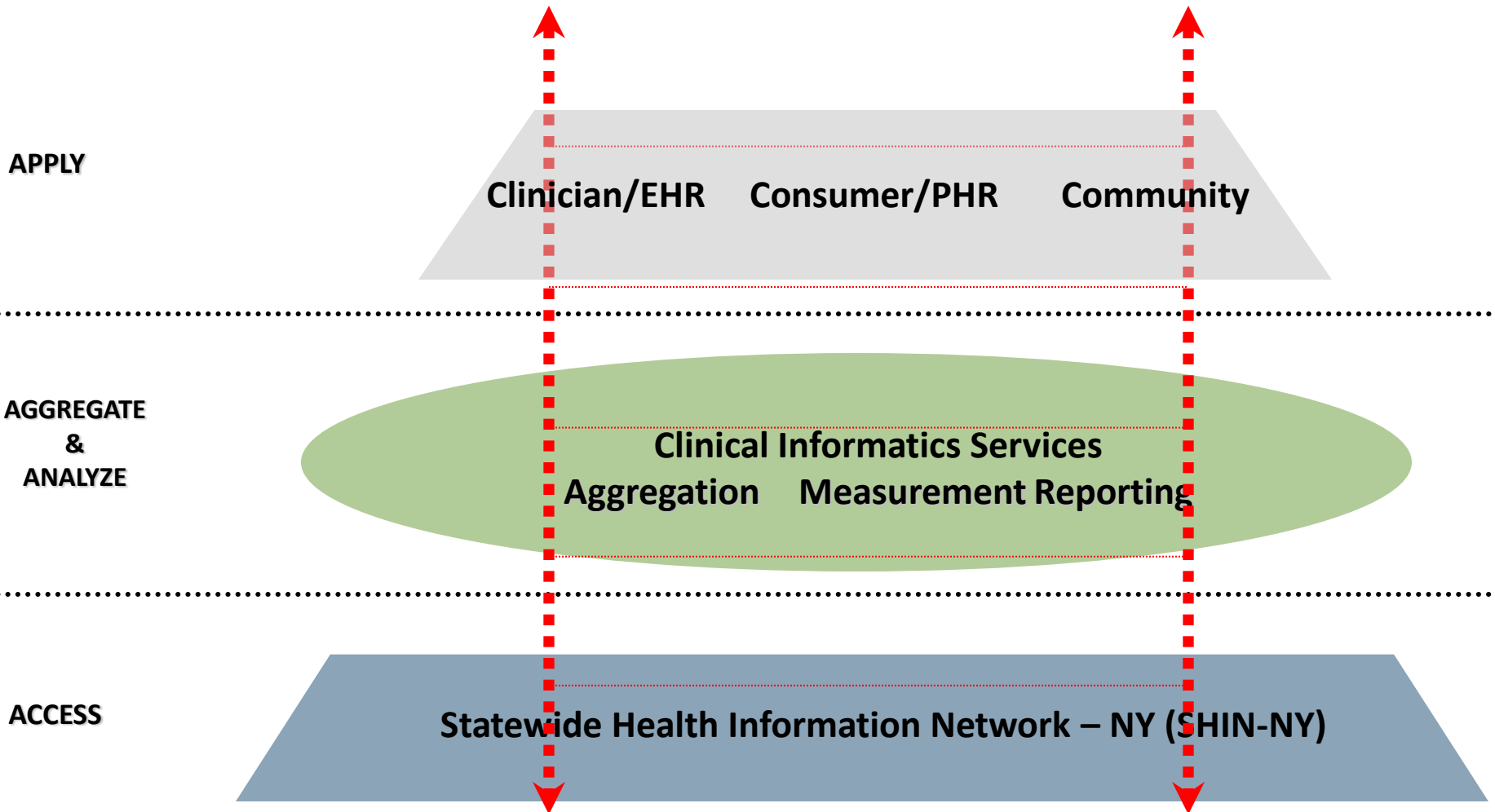

# Governance and Organizational Components: Policy Development and Implementation Framework

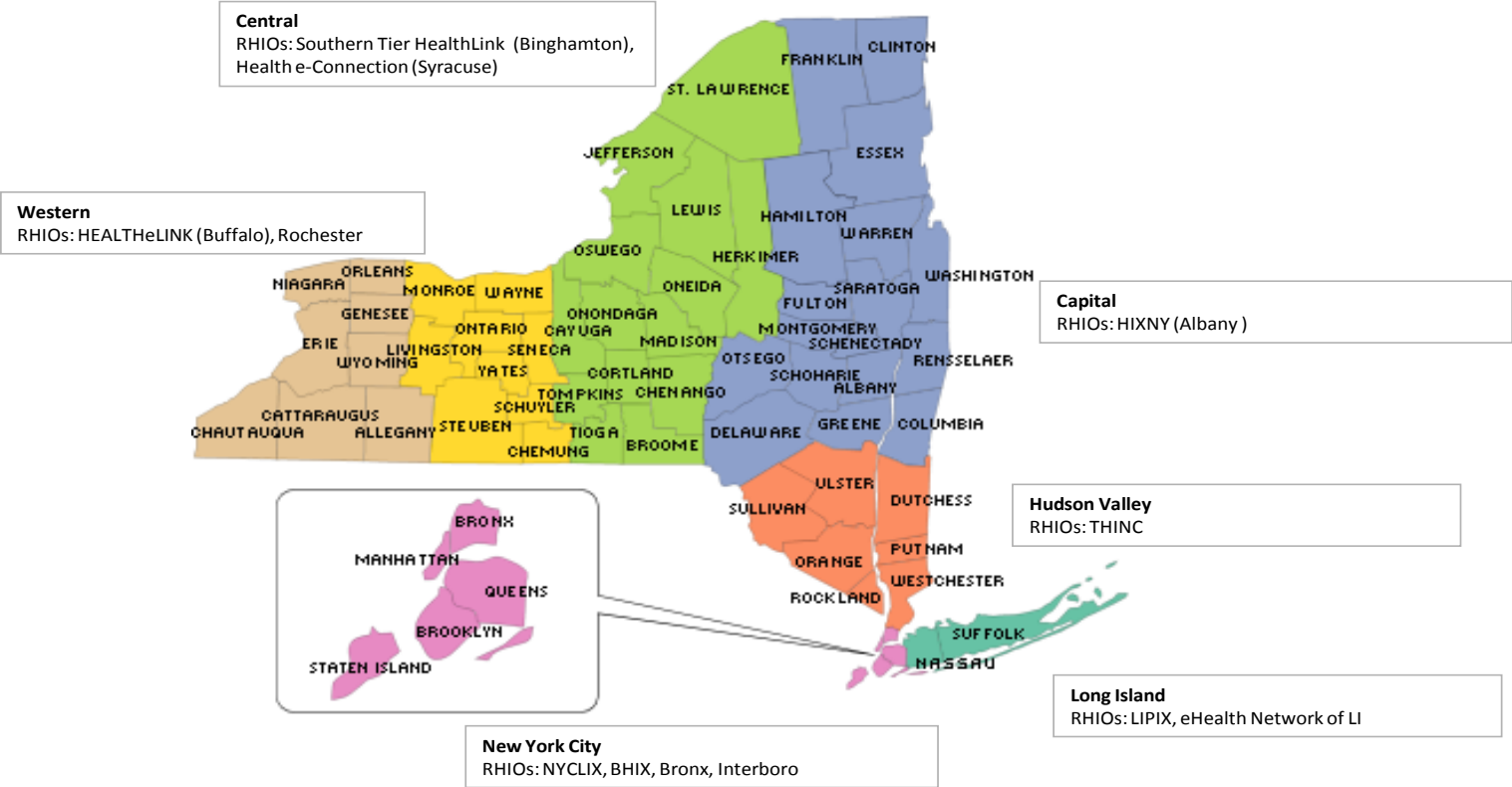


# Framework for New York Health IT Strategy

# RHIO Consent “Rules of the Road” Adopted by NYS

- Consent for access to information
- No consent required for uploading or converting data
- Consent obtained at provider organization or practice level
- Consent for treatment, quality improvement/care management
- Consent for payment and other uses
- Access to data in a medical emergency or for public health reporting

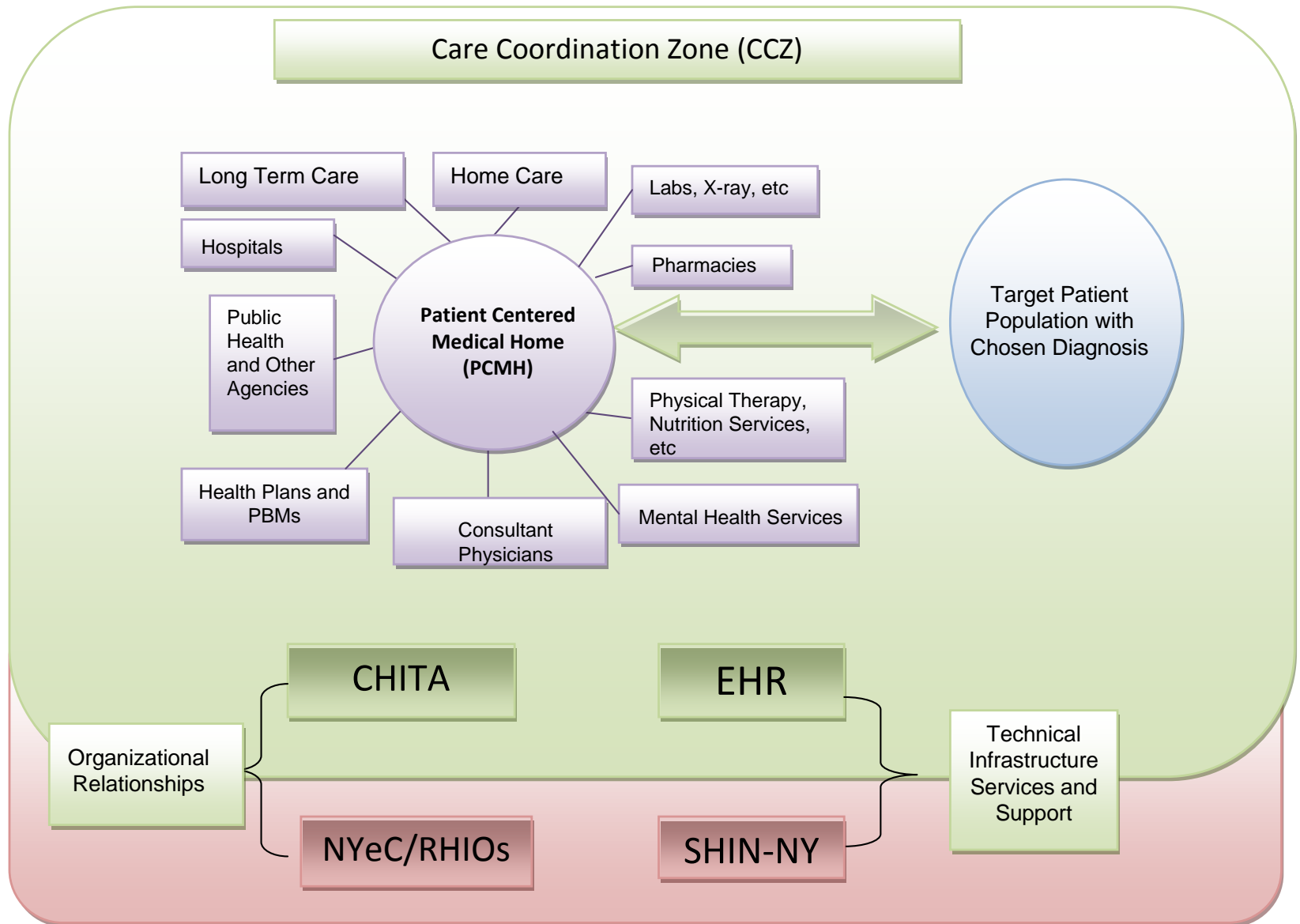
# Focus on Adoption!

- Clinical requirements and workflow analysis for use cases
- CHITAs (including NYC PCIP) provide a focal point for community-based adoption support
- Complementary efforts through MSSNY grants, CHCANYS network, IPRO (NYS QIO)
- Primary care medical home projects will integrate health IT, HIE, clinical measures, and financial incentives

**ONGOING ATTENTION TO ADOPTION SUPPORT IS NEEDED TO ENSURE HEALTH IT DRIVES IMPROVEMENTS IN CLINICAL CARE AND ORGANIZATION!**

# NYS Commitment to Fund Health IT

- **HEAL 1** – (\$50 million) – seed funding for regional HIE governance models and EHR adoption support
- **HEAL 5** – (\$106 million) – statewide governance and policy model; interoperability standards for health information exchange and EHRs; clinical priority use cases integrated at all levels; EHR adoption support
- **HEAL 10 + 17 – (\$240 million)**
  - **EHR implementation to achieve improved care coordination through support of the patient centered medical home (H17 includes focus on behavioral health and LTC providers)**
  - Continued operation of governance/policy process and statewide interoperability
